MELNEA CASS'S GLASSES—SOLUTION

As hinted by the relic being a pair of glasses and the phrase "touchy subject," this puzzle uses Braille! Solvers should answer the true/false test without any changes at first while taking note of the fact that four of the six statements in each question use a word from the feeder answers: old/oldest (AGE OLD), big/biggest (BIG BUSINESS), cold/coldest (GRAB A COLD ONE), and odd (ODDS BODKINS). After answering the questions, solvers should, as hinted by the flavortext, "flip their perspective" on those answers, changing True to False and vice versa; since "true answers are full of facts," T equals a full circle in Braille, and "false answers ring hollow," so F equals an empty circle. The answers—after being swapped by the Glasses—are below:

For the curious, here are the "correct" statements for the trickier statements:

Rig Soldiers

Geography: South Sudan is the *newest* country as of 2025, and the shortest distance between two capitals is the two miles between Kinshasa, Democratic Republic of the Congo and Brazzaville of the Republic of the Congo.

Tabletop Games: The shortest chess game ends in three moves (the "fool's mate"), D&D features an even number of attributes, and the oldest game in the Toy Hall of Fame is chess.

Animal Kingdom: The blue whale is the world's largest mammal by mass (the Etruscan shrew is the smallest!), and the shortest gestation period belongs to the stripe-faced dunnart (just eleven days—African elephants, by contrast, are pregnant for *twenty-two months*).

Disney Animated Movies: *The Black Cauldron* was among Disney's biggest box-office bombs, and the oldest animated feature–mentioned just below–is *Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs*.

Video Games: Adventure of Link is the second game in the Zelda series, and Sly Cooper is a raccoon–warm-blooded!

Boston Bits: Two lanterns meant "by sea" during Paul Revere's ride, and the Blue Line is the shortest MBTA subway.

Puzzlin' Fun: The oldest known puzzle is the *Stomachion* (a type of tangram), the provided Morse code spells "ZANY," the world's biggest jigsaw puzzle measures nearly 49 by 79 feet, and the shortest MIT Hunt on record was, to the best of our knowledge, in 2017.
